Grade-level winners awarded at every school!

#### **RULES:**

- The art contest will be judged at each grade level (K 12).
- ★ 1st 3rd place awards will be presented to winners in each grade, at each school. 1st place winners from each school will then be judged for statewide awards.
- ★ Statewide winners will be presented with a certificate and a \$100 scholarship check. Artwork will be displayed online and in the summer issue of *The Mississippi Lawyer*.
- Artwork must be submitted via email and must be received by Thursday, April 3, 2025. See box at right.
- Artwork must be student's own work; no tracings, no glitter, no coloring pages where outlines are already provided.
- Any misspelled word on the artwork will result in disqualification.
- Artwork must reflect the theme (see the top of this page) and include the words "Out of Many, One"
- 📩 All mediums accepted. Creativity is awarded. Color preferred.
- $\star$  Each must be done on at least 8.5 x 11 paper.
- 🜟 Organize multiple entries by school grade before submitting.
